greater Jagara began. Established under pressing needs there was encouraging response from the aspiring students of this college. In the matter of academic attainment the college has completely tried to fulfill the goal for which it was born. At present, a provincialised college since (01-01-2013), the College has crossed its thirty eight years of glorious history.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Uttar Kampith Mahavidyalaya follows the curriculum of Gauhati University, it's affiliating University, in all its programs. It is a good curriculum and it needs to be delivered effectively.

The Academic Committee of the college prepares an Annual and Half-yearly (sometimes)

Academic Calendar based on the calendar of the Gauhati University. A Daily Class Routine is

also prepared by the Academic Committee. The Academic Calendar and the Daily Class Routine help in planning for optimal student's engagement in learning. All the Heads of the departments distribute the courses amongst the faculty members and prepare the Departmental Class Routine. Lesson plans are prepared by individual teachers detailing learning activities to meet the course objectives. The Examination Committee plans and conducts the Sessional and End-Semester examinations. The Three Year Degree Course had been started since the beginning of the college, Semester system had been introduced by the college since 2011-2012 and CBCS System has been implemented from the academic session2019-2020 as per guidelines of Gauhati University. Classroom interaction methods range from the chalk and board method to the use of ICT tools. Learning assessment employs approaches like Group Discussions, Debate, Quiz and Seminars.

Tutorial classes are also taken for specific needs. The curriculum has also been enriched through diversity of activities like Guest-Lectures, Field Excursions, Wall Magazine, Yoga etc. The Project Works and Field Works give the student the opportunities of experiential learning. Somefaculty members of the college participate in assessment and evaluation process of Gauhati University. The college collects feedbacks from the students, teachers, parents and alumni.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The college impress students from diverse backgrounds from within the state. Admission to its programs are based on merit and statutory reservation of seat for notified categories, including Divyangan is maintained. Students are put to continuous evolution through class test, group discussion, quiz, extempore speech etc to engage and motivate them effectively in the teaching-learning process and assessed them accordingly. Innovative learning methods take the students beyond the classroom and show them the relevance of learning of their learning in the wider world outside. The college adopts different strategies and methodologies like remedial classes, special classes on difficult topics to improve the slow learners. The college adopts different problem solving methods like Educational Excursion, Field Trips, Project Report Preparation, and participation in Extension-Activities, Experimental Learning, and Participatory Learning etc.to enhance the quality of education, a number of student centric group activities, innovative and effective method, individual guidance etc are practiced in teaching learning process of the college. Alongside the diverse learning processes there is continuous Internal Evaluation through seasonal Examination and a variety of projects, assignments and presentations conducted by individual departments. At present there are 30 fulltime faculties in the college with long experience of teaching and dedication for the profession. They are concerned for the overall development of the students. The average pass percentage of student is 81% during last five years.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Research and Innovation is an important part of a college to scale high of the intellectual knowledge of the teachers as well as students. To fulfill this aim, the college publishes ISBN Research based books, every year with the help of various departments of the institution. The college has done

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Faculty Development Programme to enhance intellectual development of the teachers. Attempts have also been made by organizing Departmental Seminars/Webinars and Workshops to facilitate the all-round development of the students and teachers. The institution undertakes some skill development programmes to the students to engage themselves in various fields in future. The institution also undertakes various extension activities involving students on regular basis and these are primarily targeted at different communities of the neighborhood. With the help of NSS Unit and different committees and Cells, the college organizes some awareness programmes on Health and Hygiene, Garbage Disposal and Cleanliness. The NSS Unit of the college has undertaken many programmes, like plantation, Swachcha Bharat Abhijan etc. to maintain biodiversity of the area. The NSS Unit also focuses on some awareness programmes against mal practices prevalent in the society. For the beautification of the college campus, the college arranges three flowrical gardens whereas several indigenous species including medicinal plants are found. The college has adopted one school i.e. Dwarikanath Lakshmipriya High School and has provided priority in achieving a holistic development of the school. The institution has done different types of extension activities like plantation, special health camp, cleanliness etc. in the school. The institution has also adopted one village i.e. 2 No Naptiparaand tries for all-round development of the village. For this purpose, the college has donated books to thevillage library and has done plantation programme, Swachcha Abhijan, awareness programme etc. The institution has made two MoUs with the two colleges namely Dhamdhama Anchalik College, Nalbari, Assam and Gyanpeeth Degree College, Nikashi, Assam for intellectual exchange among the institutions. Moreover, different departments of the college have departmental MOUs with other college departments. The college also has MOUs with KHOJ(NGO) and Gram Unnayan Samity (NGO).

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

There are 13 classrooms and a 200 sitter Seminar Hall in Uttar Kampith Mahavidyalaya.

The college has a Computer Centre with 22 no's of Computers fitted with Windows 7 software and with high-speed LAN connectivity and 02 ICT classrooms. The college has a Digital Classroom with video conferencing facility and an airy and well lighted Library with 3152 Text Books and 566 Reference Books 396 College Published Books and subscriptions 02 Newspapers and 04 Magazines and 46 Journals. The Library has 03 Computers and it is

automated with Integrated Library Management System. The Library has also developed to

Digital Library cum Institutional Repository with open source software. It has attractive

browsing spaces as well, as Reading Room. Additionally the college premises are fully Wi Fi

enabled. The college has a Laboratory with practical equipments in Education Department. The college has a Football ground, Volleyball and Badminton Courts, Table Tennis facilities in

Indoor Stadium. A Teacher In-charge of Sports looks after all intra-college and inter-institutional sports programs. There are two sports teams namely Football and Kabaddi is available in our college. Students are encouraged to take part in various cultural activities and events like College Week, Freshmen Social, Quiz, Essay Writing, Debate, Extempore Speech competitions etc. and also cultural functions and competitions held every year. The college follows the rules and guidelines of the GB for any policy making and infrastructure development. There are committees like Construction Committee and Academic Committee to make decisions at the implementation level. The responsibility to conduct the annual internal auditing has been assigned to a designated CA firm.

Student Support and Progression

The students of the college are supported both scholarships and free ships by the

government. The college also helps the very poor students financially, Students under BPL

(Below poverty line) category are provided free ships by the government. Their Career concern capability enhancement and general wellbeing are addressed through various workshops for competitive examination, remedial coaching, career counseling etc while some committees like grievance redressal, prevention of sexual harassment and anti ragging measures are taken for the comfort and safety of the students. The students also participated and to excel in their co-curricular activities and in cultural activities and sports held in college and other places. Some students participated in district level Kabaddi, Debate, Quiz competition. The students' Union of the college is an important platform for the students to learn about academic and administrative responsibility. It is an elected body of students representatives formed through an annual election. There is a constitution for it. Its works include annual College Week, Republic Day, Saraswati Puja, Independence Day, International YOGA Day etc.. Students are also represented in almost all statutory bodies of the college like IQAC, Anti Ragging Committee, and Grievance Redressal Committee etc. Many decisions are taken in consultation with the students who are acknowledging as significant stakeholders maintain the character and tradition of the college. To maintain physical fitness of the students and the Staffs various sports equipments are available in the college. Awareness programs on Health and Hygiene have been organized by the IQAC in the college. The college organizes information and career counseling and personality development programs time to time to improve over all personalities of the students'. The College has a Research, Publication and Women Studies cell and they organize various programs in the college and nearby villages. The college has an NSS Unit and its members work for social service, cleanliness and plantation program in the college and various places. The college has an active Alumni Association. Most of the alumni take interest in the development of the college by contributing finical helps and Cooperate for the overall upliftment of the college.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The College is established in a rural area with the vision to provide quality education to

the poor rural students for transforming the lives of the rural masses. We are continuously trying to provide value education and to transform the campus into a centre of excellence. Our college aims to fulfill the academic requirement of everyone irrespective of caste or creed. It aims at enhancing collaboration among colleges, organizations and other leading institutions of the area with a view to provide opportunities to the students for higher studies. The faculty members take classes voluntarily in the nearby colleges with a view to motivate the students.

The Institution follows a participatory mode of Governance with all the stakeholders,

authority, Teaching, Non- teaching, Alumni and present student fraternity. The Governing Body delegates authority to the President and Principal who in turn share with the other functionaries of the institutions. The Principal/ Secretary, forms the nucleus of the administration and is the final authority of all financial matters. The Principal is vested with the day today running of the institution and has the entire HOD, IQAC coordinator, the teachers, Librarian and the Head assistant to assist him in smooth discharge of work. For effective institutional practices teacher's engagement and participation are made in the different committees like Academic Council entrusted with the framing of schedule and other academic related works. The Examination Committee executes all activities related to college internal and external examination. The finance committee entrusted to frame the annual budget for institution and the concerned committee fulfils the task of all purchase and works in collaboration with administrative staff. The construction committee takes all decision regarding the renovation, remodeling, construction related matters. The Admission committee monitor the entire process of admission is maintaining the reservation policy as per the government of Assam rules and regulations. Student's participation in the management is made by their inclusion of their expresentative in college student union (SUUKM) and also through individual necessity. In addition to it, college alumni extend their active participation in various college events.

The college is promoting not to use one time used plastic in the college premises. The College is also conducting some awareness Camp for banning Tobacco in the Campuses. The college has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2019 in all the departments as per the regulations of Gauhati University, Gauhati. As Syllabus design and revision is the domain of the concerned affiliating university, Uttar Kampith Mahavidyalaya has been following the curriculum designed by the Gauhati University. For proper implementation of the curriculum, the institution has a well-planned delivery system. It is done with utmost sincerity with the primal objective of reaching out to the student community through an elaborate system. The IQAC of the college coordinates the initiatives of the Academic Committee and the teaching departments towards effective curriculum delivery. The college has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2019 in all the departments as per the regulations of Gauhati University, Gauhati. The chief features of this coordinated effort are as follows:

The Academic Calendar: The Academic Committee and IQAC of the college design and frame an Academic Calendar which works as a student's guide to the college's schedule of curricular and co-curricular activities.

Classroom Interactions: In classroom, the conventional chalk and board method is supported by the use of multimedia tools. Tutorial classes are also taken to address some specific learning points. 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1.3 Curriculum Enrichment

The curriculum can be enriched with seminars, guest lectures, field excursion etc. To inculcate student with human values- Old-Age-Visits, N.G.O Collaborations, Health Check-up, Blood Donation camps are encouraged. The college celebrates World Environment Day every year on 5th June on various activities like wall magazine, plantation drive, street play and various field strips based on curriculum aspects. Besides, for all round development of the student different activities such as International Philosophy Day, International Women's Day and Human Rights Day are observed from time to time. Human values find emphasis in the college's encouragement of the practice of Yoga. The practice of yoga is popularized by observing the International Yoga Day on 21st June.

The College has always been sensible towards these cross cutting issues. The curriculum of the Gauhati University is followed in the institution and it integrates, to some extent, all the above cross cutting issues through different programmes.

Gender Sensitivity: The syllabus of Economics, English, History, Political Science and Education include issues related to gender sensitivity. Economics has this issue in 5th and 6th semester, English has in 1st and 2nd semester, History has in all semesters, Political Science has in all except third semester and Education has in 5th and 6th Semester.

Environment and Sustainability: The College runs a compulsory paper for all students called Environmental Studies in the 2nd Semester which deals with environment protection and sustainability. 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3.4 Extension Activities

3.4.1 Extension activities are carried out in the neighborhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the last five years.

Response:

The college undertakes various extension activities involving students on regular basis and these are primarily targeted at different communities of the neighbourhood. Extension programmes can broadly be categorized into sensitization/ awareness about different issues/ training camps/ education and endowment activities. For maintaining physical health of the students as well as the college staff, the college has undertaken various extension activities such as, (1) Yogasana and Meditation, (2) Free health check-up by the local PHE, (3) Awareness of health and hygiene of the girls' students. The college has organized special health check-up of the girl students for maintaining good health of the students. The NSS Unit of the college organizes special camps in the village, where various awareness programmes on health and hygiene, garbage disposal and cleanliness are done.

The institution endeavours many plantation programmes in order to maintain environmental balance which would make the surrounding greeny and beautiful. The institution undertakes plantation programmes on various occasions. Plantation of various saplings is done in places like college campus, parks, adopted school and in adopted village. Apart from plantation programme, the college has undertaken Swachcha Bharat campaign in various places including the college campus. Moreover, by organizing poster making competitions, rallies and street plays etc., the college tries to sensitize students and society at large on critical contemporary issues like discriminations, climate change and health education.
